Parent Teacher Interviews Wednesday, March 27, 2013 2:00 – 4:00 p.m., Oak Bay East Gym - Classes dismiss at 1:20 p.m.

This round of conferences we will again use the electronic conference manager, as described below. Also, please be reminded that the March conferences are specifically for parents of students who are struggling in class(es).

The first time you use the Conference Manager you will be required to register for a new account, this only takes a minute or two. Please make note of your password as this same account will be used for the duration of the time you have children at Oak Bay. While parents can register at any time, booking of conferences will begin at 6:00 pm on the evening of Wednesday, March 6th, 2013 and will close at noon, Monday, March 25th, 2013.

Steps for registering and booking conferences:

- 1) In your browser type: https://oakbay.schoolsoft.ca (note there is NO www in the URL)
- 2) Register for a parent account
 - a. click the **REGISTER NOW** button and complete the registration page. Once registered you will be able to log in to the Conference Manager right away.
 - b. An email will also be sent to the address you specified that restates your user name and password. This email will be addressed from appointments@schoolsoft.ca (please check to be sure your system doesn't flag email from this address as junk)
- 3) Click the **BOOK NOW** button.
- 4) Select conference date and the teacher(s) you wish to meet with
- 5) Click the **NEXT** button
 - a. To coordinate bookings involving multiple teachers select from the list all the teachers applicable to your child(ren) whom you wish to meet with
 - b. Click on an available time slot for each teacher and complete the booking form that appears. You will see the booking appear in the summary list on the right hand side of the screen.
 - c. A confirmation email is sent for each booking you made or subsequently cancel/change.
 - d. You will also receive a reminder email and itinerary early in the morning of the conference date.
- 6) Confirm your appointments by looking at the **CURRENTLY BOOKED CONFERENCES** box on the right of the screen **OR** click **MY CONFERENCES** tab.
 - a. Only appointments that appear in this box, or on the My Conferences page are confirmed bookings
- 7) When finished booking, click the log off button (top right on the window).
- 8) You will have the opportunity to provide feedback regarding the use of the Conference Manager to the school administration through a user survey before completely exiting. We would appreciate you completing the survey as this helps us as we determine how conferences are booked in the future.

We greatly appreciate parents booking their own appointments, but know this is not always possible. If you are unable to book your own appointment, please call the school office (east or west office) and we'll be happy to assist you over the phone.

Please complete the Online PSI Selections form if you are graduating and applying to a PSI this school year.

An instructional document is available at: https://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/exams/trx_updates/. The instructions include snap shots of all the screens students will use to select PSIs.

Students access the online form by logging into the Student Secure Web (SSW),

https://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/exams/tsw/tsw/student/, and clicking the menu option "Post-Secondary Institutions Selections".

Note: Students who do not yet have a SSW account will need to **create one** at the above SSW Website prior to gaining access to the PSI Selections form.

Students must complete the PSI Selections as soon as possible to have interim transcript information forwarded in May 2013 to the BC Electronic PSIs list and to the OUAC institutions.
