GRADING

This course works on a mastery system. You must pass the mastery tests in each unit to the 80% level before you can go on. In addition, there are cumulative tests from time to time. These are tests you can take only once, so studying before them is essential to do well. Your final mark for the course is based 60% on mastery tests and 40% on cumulative tests.

Students are reminded that this is a provincially examinable course. The mark you receive from your teacher only counts for 80% of your final mark for the course. The other 20% comes from the provincial exam you must write. Be sure to ask your teacher for a practice provincial exam, available from the Ministry of Education website, <u>www.bced.gov.bc.ca</u>, that you can write and mark before you write the real thing.

GOAL

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills at avoiding five common grammar errors.

OBJECTIVES

While completing this unit you will practice identifying and fixing problems with:

- Run-on sentences.
- Sentence fragments.
- Sentences with too many or two few commas.
- Vague pronoun references.
- Wrong pronouns in number, gender or person.

- This unit uses the textbook *Reading and Writing for Success*.
- Ask your teacher for the Unit 1 Worksheet.
- Read pp. 194-198 on how sentences work.
- Read the examples for Error #1 on p.198, do the practice questions in the textbook, then the additional practice questions on the worksheet.
- Read the examples for Error #2 on p.199, do the practice questions in the textbook, then the additional practice questions on the worksheet.
- Read the examples for Error #3 on p.200, do the practice questions in the textbook, then the additional practice questions on the worksheet.
- Read the examples for Error #4 on p.202, do the practice questions in the textbook, then the additional practice questions on the worksheet.
- Read the examples for Error #5 on p.203, do the practice questions in the textbook, then the additional practice questions on the worksheet.
- When you are ready, ask your teacher for the Unit 1 Test. Remember, you must get 80% to pass, so studying hard is essential to do well.

- Using the wrong modifier.

- Read the examples for Error #8 on p.208, do the practice questions in the textbook, then the additional practice questions on the worksheet.
- Read the examples for Error #9 on p.209, do the practice questions in the textbook, then the additional practice questions on the worksheet.

- Ask your teacher for the Unit 3 Workbook.
- Read pp. 140-143 in the textbook. Be sure to follow the notes in the margin on pp.142-143 of the sample paragraphs.
- Read pp.144-147 in the textbook.
- Do the work in the Unit 3 Workbook. Be sure to hand in the assignments so your teacher may mark them and give you feedback on your paragraph writing.
- When you are ready, ask your teacher for the Unit 3 Test. Remember, you must get 80% to pass, so studying hard is essential to do well.

GOAL

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with creating essay outlines.

OBJECTIVES

While completing this unit you will investigate the following topics and practice working with

- the elements of a five paragraph essay.
- how to plan an essay so it suits a particular audience or purpose.
- using an outline to help you write an essay.

- This unit uses the textbook *Reading and Writing for Success*.
- Ask your teacher for the Unit 4 Workbook.
- Read pp.150-159 in the textbook.
- Do the work in the Unit 4 workbook. This will count as your Unit 4 test, so be sure to do a good job on it.

GOAL

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with writing a basic five paragraph essay.

OBJECTIVES

While completing this unit you will investigate the following topics and practice working with

• writing an essay from an outline you have prepared.

- This unit uses the textbook *Reading and Writing for Success*.
- Re-read pp.158-159 in the textbook.
- Ask your teacher for the Unit 5 Test. Choose an essay outline you prepared in Unit 4 or prepare a new outline on a topic you have your teacher's permission to write about, and write a proper five paragraph essay. Be sure to follow the checklist there before stapling it to the front of your essay, and handing it in for marking. Remember, **plagiarism** is considered cheating and will result in a mark of zero for the test!
- Go over your work from Units 3-5 in preparation for Cumulative Test #2. When you are ready to write it, ask your teacher. Remember, this test is one chance only, so do your best.

GOAL

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with analysing news articles for the features they contain, their organization, and bias.

OBJECTIVES

While completing this unit you will investigate the following topics and practice working with

- what features a typical news article has.
- what information a news article contains and how the information is organized.
- what the term *slant* means, and how to identify it in a news article.

- This unit uses the textbook *Reading and Writing for Success*.
- Ask your teacher for the Unit 6 Workbook.
- Read pp.70-71. Be sure you know the bold terms on p.71. They are sure to be on the test.
- Read pp.72-77. Be sure you know the checklist on p.77. Do the *Writing Analysis* at the bottom of p.76.
- Read pp.78–81, and do the assignment, *Seeing the Slant* on p.80.
- Do the assignments in the Unit 6 Workbook.
- When you are ready, ask your teacher for the Unit 6 Test. Remember, you must get 80% to pass, so studying hard is essential to do well.

GOAL

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with reading and understanding short stories.

OBJECTIVES

While completing this unit you will investigate the following topics and practice working with

- the elements of a short story.
- how to summarize the elements of a short story.
- how to use a response journal while reading a short story.
- how to make a character web.

- This unit uses the textbooks Reading and Writing for Success, and Sightlines 10.
- Ask your teacher for the Unit 7 Workbook.
- In *Reading and Writing for Success*, read pp.12-29. Do the Response Journal assignment found on p.26 and the Summary assignment found on p.29.
- In the Unit 7 Workbook, follow the instructions there and hand your worksheet in for feedback from your teacher.
- When you are ready, ask your teacher for the Unit 7 Test. Remember, you must get 80% to pass, so studying hard is essential to do well.

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with reading, analysing and understanding poetry.

OBJECTIVES

While completing this unit you will investigate the following topics and practice working with

- how to read a poem.
- how to write a response to a poem.
- how to recognize the elements of poetry.

- Ask your teacher for the Unit 8 Workbook.
- In *Reading and Writing for Success*, read pp.30-39. Do the assignments found throughout this section.
- Complete the work in the Unit 8 Workbook.
- When you are ready, ask your teacher for the Unit 8 Test. Remember, you must get 80% to pass, so studying hard is essential to do well.
- Go over your work from Units 6-8 in preparation for Cumulative Test #3. When you are ready to write it, ask your teacher. Remember, this test is one chance only, so do your best.

GOAL

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with reading, analysing and understanding a novel.

OBJECTIVES

While completing this unit you will investigate the following topics and practice working with

- reading a work of fiction
- analysing what you have read
- gaining a better understanding of what you read

- This unit uses the *The Chrysalids*.
- Ask your teacher for the workbook which accompanies the novel you chose. The workbook will count as your test for Unit 9, so do a good job on the questions
- Ask your teacher for Cumulative #4, which is an essay on the novel you read. Remember, this essay may only be submitted once, so do your best on it.
