- 1. Macbeth is first presented to us as a brave and honoured soldier. Why is this important?
- 2. Macbeth and Banquo react differently to the witches' prophecies. Why? How will this affect the play?
- 3. What does Lady Macbeth read in the letter from her husband?
- 4. There is something Lady Macbeth fears about her husband. What is it?
- 5. Who is more frightened by the plan to kill Duncan: Macbeth, or his wife? Support your opinion with evidence from the play.
- 6. How does Lady Macbeth bolster her husband's courage and resolve to kill Duncan? What arguments does she use?

ACT II

- 7. How do Banquo and Macbeth regard each other at the beginning of the Act?
- 8. After the "dagger speech," is Macbeth becoming more or less determined than he seemed in Act I?
- 9. How is the sense of horror heightened at the beginning of Scene II?
- 10. When the porter knocks, what dramatic effect does this have?
- 11. Why did Macbeth kill the grooms? Was it a wise move? Is he thinking clearly at this point?
- 12. What would likely have happened to Duncan's sons if they hadn't fled?

ACT III

13. Why does Macbeth want Banquo killed?

- 14. What reasons does Macbeth give to the murderers for killing Banquo? What does this conversation reveal about Macbeth?
- 15. What is happening to Macbeth's sense of morality?
- 16. Many consider Scene IV the climax or turning point in the play. Do you agree? Why or why not?
- 17. When Banquo's ghost appears, what dramatic purpose does this serve?
- 18. Compare the reaction of Lady Macbeth and her husband to the appearance of Banquo's ghost.

ACT IV

- 19. In what ways does Shakespeare create a feeling of horror and impending doom at the beginning of this Act?
- 20. What are the three new prophecies made to Macbeth by the witches?
- 21. Which of the three new prophecies seems the most immediately dangerous?
- 22. How are Macbeth's morals affected by the witches' predictions?
- 23. Why did Macbeth deliberately search out the witches? How does he take the answer he gets?
- 24. How does the murder of Macduff's family differ from that of Banquo?
- 25. Malcolm misrepresents his own character to Macduff. Why?

ACT V

- 26. How does Shakespeare show that Lady Macbeth has been brooding over past crimes? What is she obsessing about?
- 27. How does Shakespeare foreshadow Lady Macbeth's death?
- 28. What is Macbeth's reaction to the death of his wife?
- 29. What dramatic purpose is there in having eight short scenes in the last act?
- 30. How is each of the prophecies the witches made revealed?
