### **Grade 12 Student Transcript Service**

The Ministry of Education has created a new online service for students to view their final marks, scholarships and transcript, and send transcripts electronically. This new online service replaces the Post-Secondary Institutions Choices form (PSI).

The new Student Transcript Service allows students to:

- ♦ View final grades for completed courses and assessment results
- ♦ Order and send transcript to post-secondary institutions
- View transcript order status and history
- ♦ Order and send transcript to employers
- ♦ View BC scholarships awarded, expiry and redemption status

#### School Liaison Officer Protects His Turf

Last week, the Oak Bay Police advised of numerous bike thefts from Oak Bay High School. We're pleased to advise that today, we have one 45 yr old male in custody with multiple charges pending.

Oak Bay Police Department's School Liaison Officer, Cst. Lueder used a Police Mountain Bike as bait near Oak Bay High School this morning. He surveilled the bike for several hours until an unknown male approached the bike, opened his backpack, and began cutting the lock.

Cst. Lueder left his observation point and arrested the suspect.

The Oak Bay Police are recommending several charges including:

- Attempted Theft Under \$5000
- Mischief Under \$5000
- Possession of Breaking Tools (photos below)
- Possession Stolen Property (credit cards, etc)

#### Oak Bay Police Create Bike Registry

While Oak Bay continues to be a very safe community, it is not uncommon to have bikes stolen from schools, businesses or residences. In an effort to facilitate the return of recovered bikes, the Oak Bay Police have created its first Bike Registry.

We hope Oak Bay residents will register their bikes with us. In the unlikely event that their bike is stolen, this will help us return it and also assist us in identifying it as stolen property so we can charge the person in possession of it.

Police exhibit lockers end up filled with bikes by year's end. Currently, they go to auction or donation but we would be very pleased to return them to their rightful owner.

Other area Police Departments can also search our Registry.

Oak Bay residents can go to our website to learn how. We have forms at our office and it only takes a minute to complete.
