APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of September 25, 2017 were approved.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

- 1. Finance forms (ie gaming request forms) were released Friday. We expect them to be return by next week. I will then meet with the committee and invite Christine (and others) to join to review the requests. Hopefully we will have our requests solidified by November.
- 2. I am working with our Track and Field teachers to refinish the track and level the field on the south end of the school lot. We are applying for a variety of grants and are teaming with Victoria Track and Field to raise \$200,000. The District has put forward \$50,000.
- 3. The Rugby pitch is still unusable and the issue is presently before lawyers. The original developer has sold his firm and there are some issues regarding party responsible for bringing the field up to the standard as was originally planned.
- 4. Cops for Cancer was amazing. I'm so pleased and proud of our community raising \$90,000 to send kids to summer camp!
- 5. The administrative team is bringing forward a plan for a school committee focusing on student health. We are looking for active student involvement and wish to explore avenues to help our students make healthy decisions with regards to "consent", drugs and alcohol and other issues for our adolescents to consider.

- 6. We have experienced a rash of bike thefts in the recent weeks and are working with OB Police to address. I have suggested the police come and have an "engraving" session with the student cycles.
- 7. As part of the new Careers and Pathways curriculum, we are encouraging all our GRADE 9 students to participate in Take Our Kids to Work Day (Nov 1). A registration package (including a reflective assignment) has been released to students through English 9 classes. Any student unable to participate is expected to attend classes.
- 8. Interim reports will be sent home on Thursday for students who the teachers feel are struggling in one or more aspects of a course (homework, tests, completion timelines, etc).
- Re. Cell phones in classrooms during instructional time: Partial feedback indicates that 85% of teachers feel that cell phones are not a problem. Randi will have a more comprehensive report at the November PAC meeting.

- Motion to close OBSSSEE account, move the Gaming Account to CIBC (from BMO), and open a general PAC account also at CIBC. This will centralize our bank accounts. Motion approved.
