On **Friday, May 11th**, Oak Bay High will be practising an **Emergency Reunification Drill.** Parents will be asked to bring picture ID, and sign their child(ren) out of school between 12:55 - 1:55 pm. A pre-determined, practised reunification method ensures the reunification process will not further complicate what would already be a chaotic, and anxiety filled situation in the aftermaths of a disaster.

Parental responsibility for the pick up of their child on May 11th will be explained at the Parent Workshops as well as in next week's OB newsletter.

We realize that during the afternoon on May 11th, many of our grade 12s will be getting ready for their grad dinner dance and so will not be participating in the reunification event.


- + Human (and adolescent) development
