Integrated Youth Service Centre

The Foundry is setting up an integrated youth service centre in the city, for youth aged 12-24. The Foundry are keen to ensure that the new centre meets the needs of parents/guardian and families as well as young people.

The idea is to gain a better understanding of the barriers and what's working well for young people and their families in accessing health services and supports. The plan is to collect this information before each Foundry site is fully operational, to get a sense of the types of services youth and their families have been accessing and to identify any gaps. A follow-up survey will be available a year after each Foundry site opens.
