Congratulations to the Sr. Boys Volleyball Team for their strong finish at the B.C. Championships this week, at 7th place. Following a close loss to #4 Moscrop in the quarterfinals (19-25, 25-27, 24-26), the boys had little to give later that day in the consolation semi-final vs. Mt. Baker of Cranbrook. They rebounded with a very convincing win vs. rivals Argyle of North Vancouver: the grade 12s won the first set 25-23, the grade 11s and 10s almost won the second set 24-26, and the 12s came back on to dominate the third 15-5.
