Oak Bay High School Timetable Review

We are now into our 3rd month of our new bell schedule. Anecdotal feedback from students, parents and staff is generally positive and we will continue to monitor the success and challenges of this model. Part of our monitoring will be collection of data on student use of FOCUS time. This is time in which we expect students to register their attendance in a FOCUS period; thus giving us some information on the use/demand for this less structured, more independent time.

Data for OCTOBER showed Grade 12 overall attendance at 29%

Grade 11 at 39%

Grade 10 at 41%

Grade 9 at 54%

The tracking system for FOCUS attendance is not without its challenges, particularly as we settle into our new school year routines, and it is my expectation that the data for the next month show an improvement in commitment to this "gift of time."
