Message from the Principal

As you are aware, our return to our educational programming after Spring Break is looking much different for our learning community. Our District, in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and schools is exploring methods for the continuity of learning for all our students. At Oak Bay High School, we plan to meet frequently with the staff (using an online video conference system) to update our teachers and help keep our messaging as consistent and clear as possible. We will be asking Advisory teachers to reach out to the students in their advisory to check in and determine if there are specific supports required by the student to continue learning using a different framework. Students will be scheduled to come into the school starting next week to collect items from their lockers that are required for learning. Teachers will be supported as they explore alternative methods for designing and delivering lessons which will allow the student to complete the necessary course requirements to graduate or move on to a subsequent grade.

A final grade will be prepared for students based on work prior to the spring break **and** the assessment of participation in learning opportunities that will occur over the coming months. It needs to be stressed at this time that this is a constantly changing landscape and we are trying to be deliberate and responsive as we move forward.

Thank you for your continued support as we navigate these interesting times. We will continue pass along updates to you as we receive them either from the Ministry or the District.
