


Oak Bay High School This Week @ Oak Bay High Mar. 9-13, 2020

Dear Oak Bay High Parents/Guardians,

The Student Learning Survey (SLS) has been administered every year in B.C. public schools since 2001. Prior to 2016-17 it was known as the Student Satisfaction Survey. The SLS provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, learning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation. The SLS is the only source of province-wide information about students' learning experiences through the perspectives of students, parents/guardians, and school staff. Schools and districts use the SLS to make informed decisions around long-term planning and goal-setting, and in providing individual students personalized support. Our grade 10 and 12 students will be completing this 20 minute survey in class on March 30 – April 1.

We've worked in collaboration with the BC Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils

(BCCPAC) to update the parent/guardian survey in 2018/19 and make it more useful for parents, teachers, and schools. Your valued participation is an important contribution to improving the educational experiences of children.

The parent/guardian survey is now available online at

www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm and is available in 18 different languages. The survey will be available until Friday, April 3rd, and will take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Your responses are voluntary and anonymous, and your child will not be identified as a result of your participation in the survey. Any personal or identifying information will be deleted before results are stored. Data will be stored and accessible only within Canada.

Oak Bay High parents are asked to use the "Direct Access" section which does not require any passwords or logon codes.

The results of the parent SLS survey will be available through the Ministry of Education website

(<u>https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey</u>) and on the BCCPAC website (<u>https://bccpac.bc.ca/</u>) in summer 2020.
