Principal's Message

Over the past two-three weeks, our educational world at Oak Bay High School has been changing as we work with our teachers, support staff and the District to plan so that all of our students can continue their learning. Presently our school building has the administration team, an administrative assistant and a day custodian in attendance and we all miss seeing your children! All the staff are continuing to connect and support each other via Zoom, email and personal phone calls as we all navigate this new remote learning. I continue to be so very appreciative of this staff as they also balance their own situations and families all the while working hard to prepare and support the learning of your children.

At this point, your child should have been contacted by their advisory teacher. If not yet, please expect this to happen today. We are reaching out to determine wellness and to gauge whether technology supports are required for continuity of learning. Students with Individual Learning Plans will continue to be supported by teachers and case managers. Each child's program will be given careful consideration.

All your child's teachers will be reaching out. Some by mid -week, many following the Easter weekend, depending on the readiness of their program delivery model. All teachers have been reviewing their subject material and will be developing programming that focuses on the priority curricular competencies for all subjects. All teachers will be determining a final grade for students in June. This grade will be based on work completed prior to the spring break and assessments of work after the spring break. Teachers, parents and students must recognize that learning will now look quite different with the suspension of in-class instruction.

All students should be regularly checking their "sd61learn" email account as this is the centralized means of communication for our learning community at Oak Bay High. Furthermore, for ease of teachers, students and parents/guardians, most teachers will be utilizing Google classroom as the "one-stop shop" for educational programming. There are a number of students who have not activated or renewed their G-Suite accounts this year. Google G-Suite for Education is used to:

1. G Suite for Education learn email account (ie @sd61learn.ca)

2. Google Drive – unlimited storage, including docs, sheets, slides, forms, and drawing

3. Google Calendar, Google Sites and Google Classroom

4. Read&Write by TextHelp extension for Google Chrome

IMPORTANT - ALL students should verify whether or not this applies to them by following <u>this link</u> and scrolling to the end of the page. This will provide information as to whether a student needs to renew/ create an account or if they have already done so. Instructions to change a G-Suite password from home are found <u>here</u>.

To facilitate continuity of learning we have developed a schedule to allow students to access the school to collect items **essential for learning.** This schedule starts tomorrow so please ask your child to review the link below. It is important that this schedule is adhered to in an effort to control the number of students in the building at any one time and allow for physical distancing. We do not consider it essential to return overdue library books at this time, however, if a student is coming in to gather other materials, they are welcome to bring those overdue books at that time. **For the Grad Class of 2020** - Every student eligible to graduate this year will graduate. This means that if a student were to successfully complete courses underway they would satisfy all grad requirements. Students are expected to continue their learning and complete the learning assigned by their teachers while in-class learning is suspended. This includes completion of Career Life Connections (Capstone) and Career Life Explorations (usually completed in Grade 11). Ms. Taggart or Ms. Buckingham has invited all Grade 12 students to join the Google classroom for information as it becomes available.

Our Dinner and Dance for grads is scheduled for May 22, 2020, with the Graduation Recognition ceremony scheduled for June 5, 2020. At this point in time, it is still unclear whether these events will proceed as scheduled. We will relay information as it is released to us.
