Introductory School Email Grade 9

Immunization consent packages for grade 9 students will be sent home in the fall. Follow the instructions inside the consent package and return the signed consent form to the school. Students in grade 9 will be offered immunizations in school-based clinics. Please discuss the information in the consent package with your child and include them in the decision to provide consent for immunization. This is an opportunity for adolescents to start making decisions about their own health.

Immunizations will be provided at the school for grade 9 students on December 2, 2020 and December 7, 2020.

A grade 9 student can make an informed decision about immunization regardless of their parent/guardian/representative decision to consent or refuse immunization.


1. Parents As Education & Career Coaches Workshop

Parents are the greatest influence on their child's education and career decision, making this a beneficial evening!




2. <u>Careers, Trades, & Transitions Information Evening</u> *Are you:*
