Literacy 10 Provincial Assessments (Nov 2-6)

Literacy is "the ability and willingness to make meaning from text and express oneself in a variety of modes and for a variety of purposes. Literacy includes making connections, analyzing critically, comprehending, creating and communicating" - Jan Unwin, 2017

This assessment is a graduation REQUIREMENT for any student currently in grade 10 and 11. 2021 graduates (current grade 12s) do NOT have to write this assessment.

The provincial Literacy 10 Assessment is "a provincial assessment that assesses student proficiency in literacy... and is not based on a particular course, but on learning across multiple subjects, from kindergarten to Grade 10" (https://curriculum.gov.bc.ca/assessment/literacy-assessment/grade-10-literacy-assessment). The provided link includes sample assessments, scoring guide, and student exemplars. An information video will be created by Ms. Gilbert and shared out to students and families shortly. It is strongly recommended that students/families familiarize themselves with the exam format as this will help with understanding, predictability and lessening of stress on the day of the assessment. Students are permitted to re-write this assessment later this year and/or in future years. We will be offering this assessment a few times throughout the school year beginning with the first week of November. All grade 11s who have a block C class will be scheduled to write this assessment on Wednesday, November 4th starting at 9:00 AM (arrival time is 8:45 AM) and students will have 3 hours to complete the assessment. Please contact Vice-Principal, Ms. Paas (mpaas@sd61.bc.ca) if:

- You are a Grade 11 students who does not have a block C class, or
- You are a grade 10 student who is wanting to write the assessment now rather than later in the school year (recommended that you have completed English 10 in quarter 1)
- You have questions in regards to provincially required graduation assessments.

MyEd/Timetables

Our wonderful office staff have been working hard to ensure that students can access their MyEd BC student accounts. MyEd BC can be used by a student to view student transcripts, current grades (for those teachers that are using the gradebook system in MyEd), grades after a report card has been issued, previous course marks and current schedules/timetables.

During the week of October 26th (and not before to this week), students will need to login to MyEd to view their quarters 2, 3 & 4 schedule. Some timetables may have changed since the paper copy was provided to students at the beginning of September. This could be due to the construction of new classes and/or changes required in order to balance the class size and composition of classes. If students are requesting a quarter 2-4 course change, forms can be found in the office.

Here are some FAQs to guide you/your child:

What if I have never logged in to MyEd BC? Please check your @sd61learn email account throughout next week as we will be emailing your computer generated password.

What is my username? Your student number (NOT your @sd61learn account email)

What if my account has been disabled or expired? Please come in to the office or email Ms. Copeman (jcopeman@sd61.bc.ca)

What if I want a course change for my quarter 2, 3 or 4 schedule? Forms can be found in the office or here.
