Update for Covid safety measures

As you will likely have heard through the media and through our Superintendent's letter to families last week, the Ministries of Health and Education recently announced a number of enhanced safety measures for schools. Our school will be taking steps in the coming days to ensure we have fully implemented the new measures by the Feb 26th deadline.

Beginning tomorrow, Feb. 11th, our school will be implementing the following enhanced measure:

Staff and Students will now be required to wear non-medical masks in all indoor areas, including when they are with their learning groups. The only exceptions are when:

- sitting or standing at their seat or workstation in a classroom;
- there is a barrier in place; or
- they are eating or drinking

As with all new safety measures, clear communication, consistent expectations and patience will be required. Staff will communicate this new expectation as part of tomorrow's classes.

In the following days we will be working to make sure that other safety measures are in place, including: updated signage and floor marking, reviewing our entrance and exit procedures and creating plans to help reduce congestion and crowding.

As a school community we should all be very proud of our collective response to the challenges of this unique year. The students and staff have shown incredible patience, flexibility, understanding and resilience. Thank you for your continuing efforts around our collective health and safety.
