## **Grad update**

Our graduation 2021 ceremony is less than one week away. Very exciting times for our grads and their families. It was wonderful to see so many grads participate in grad formal wear day today. Yesterday we distributed the majority of the grad gowns and anyone who has not yet picked up their gown can do so in the office Friday or Monday next week.

A couple of reminders and updates:

- Please arrive at the school at the time you have signed up, no early birds please.
- Parking may be tight, especially the graduation times during the daytime on Wednesday and Thursday so please plan accordingly.
- You will enter the school from the back parking lot off Cranmore Street, not the front of the school.
- Grads are asked to wear their graduation cap and gown to the ceremony
- We are asking each grad and guests to please stay physically distanced from the other grads and guests in the graduation ceremony session
- All graduates and guests will be required to wear a mask during the graduation
- The expectation being that graduates will have the option to remove their mask for a physically distanced photo in the theatre with Mr. Aerts.
- A professional photographer will take these photos and they will be made available for families to download for free shortly after graduation.

    - b. Your parents/guests will be able to watch this from inside the theatre
  - Part 3 Photo opportunity in the cafeteria. There will be beautifully balloon decorated stages in the cafeteria for graduates and their guests to take individual and group photos on.
  - Lastly, in following the Provincial COVID 19 health and safety guidelines for this event we ask that you please do not gather after the ceremony with other grads on school grounds.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

RE: Plans for safe full-time return to school in 2021/2022 school year

The Minister of Education alongside our Provincial Health Officer announced this morning that schools will be preparing for a near normal return to school for the 2021/2022 school year. With the successful rollout of BC's vaccination program, students will be returning to the classroom for full-time learning in September.

To support a safe return to school, the Provincial government is committing \$43.6 million to be allocated across all school districts. We do not know our allocation yet. The funding will go towards enhanced cleaning measures, and to support First Nations and Métis students, mental health services and addressing learning impacts to students.

We understand that restrictions will continue to lift over the summer break. A Provincial K-12 Steering Committee is continuing to work with public health experts during the summer to finalize guidance for K-12 school settings that will be in alignment with BC's Restart Plan. We've been informed that details on masks and other safety guidelines will be released in August.

We will continue to keep you apprised of any updates. For additional details from today's announcement, please see the resources below.
