This new Federal holiday addresses one of the 94 calls to action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission: "We call upon the federal government, in collaboration with Aboriginal peoples, to establish, as a statutory holiday, a National Day of Truth and Reconciliation to honour survivors, their families and communities."
