



Five Dual Credit Courses:

ELC 120: Introduction to Learning Environments	4 credits

Students will earn 20 High School Credits and 15 college credits

Admission & Program Requirements:

Camosun's ELC Diploma:

The ELC program embraces the belief that children and families are competent and capable, and the program reflects this principle in our work with students and the community. Indigenous perspectives on supporting children and families, and connections to nature, land and place, as well as the impact of colonization and the residential school experience, are woven throughout the learning experience. Students learn how to support and strengthen children's unique and complex identities within their particular contexts. The program incorporates a sociocultural perspective of early childhood education as identified by current research and contemporary discourses. The ELC Diploma is a 2-year, 4 semester program totalling 66 credits of study and a minimum of four practicum placements (over 400 hours of applied practice with children and families).

In our Community

The Saanich Police have requested that the following message be shared with all high school communities in our school district.

UVic has had ongoing issues surrounding large crowds, unlawful behaviours, and general disorder on weekends throughout the Fall semester. It has come to the attention of UVic and the Saanich Police Department that many of the participants are high school students and persons from outside our local community.

UVic would like to remind high school students that gathering, loitering, or congregating at non-university events by persons who are not UVic community members (students, employees, and faculty) are prohibited on all property owned or occupied by UVic. UVic has requested the proactive assistance of the Saanich Police Department to prevent a recurrence of these concerning events through the enforcement of the *Trespass Act* and other related statutes.
