**Ceremony Tickets** - I am pleased to share that we have been able to approve all ceremony tickets, including the extra tickets that students requested. If you requested additional tickets you will be receiving a separate email late this afternoon requesting that you pay for those tickets via our cash online payment system. Extra tickets are \$10 each and payment is due Friday June 3rd by 4:00pm.

**Graduation Gowns** - Gowns will be available for students to pick up on Monday June 20th starting at 2pm outside the office. The gown package includes a black gown, mortarboard hat, grad 2022 tassel and v-neck stole. Grads may wish to hang or iron their gowns as they come folded and often have creases.

**Rehearsal** - All grads are asked to be at UVic at 8:30am on Thursday June 23rd for our rehearsal. No special dress is required for rehearsal.
