From Admin....

School startup has been overwhelmingly positive! It's exciting to see students engaged in learning, building social connections, and taking advantage of all the amazing opportunities available at our school. However, there are a few concerning behaviours that are arising which we are working to address. Any assistance you can provide in reinforcing these with your child/ren would be greatly appreciated.

- Litter: There is a significant volume of litter being left about the building and grounds each day. We are asking that students make the effort to place their waste into appropriate receptacles (recycling, compost and trash). The exterior spaces (ie. fields) are of particular concern.
- Restrooms: We continue to request that restrooms not be used as meeting places or "hangouts".
- **Vandalism & Graffiti:** There has been a significant increase in both vandalism and graffiti this year. While the bulk of both is taking place within the restrooms, graffiti is popping up all around the building and grounds.

If possible, we'd ask that you please speak with your child/ren about these topics. As we stated at our welcome assemblies in September, it is our collective responsibility to demonstrate respect for our school community, including both individuals and the environment around us. We are encouraging students with knowledge of any vandalism or graffiti to come forward to a staff member.

On another note, many of the Grads are seemingly engaged in a non-school sanctioned game called "Gotcha". While generally good natured, this game does come with a few concerns. We ask that you please speak with your child to ensure that their involvement is being done in a safe way that doesn't put themselves or others at risk. We would also ask that you reinforce that this game cannot impact the opportation of the school, including causing interruptions to learning, etc.
