# Upcoming PAC meeting with special session on Naloxone training for parents - Monday, February 27 7:00 pm Cafeteria

The next Parents Advisory Council (PAC) meeting will feature a hands-on Naxolone training session provided by Victoria's Youth Clinic, The Foundry.

A nurse and family peer support worker will:

- 1. present information about teens and substance use
- 2. walk through the symptoms of an opioid overdose

- 3. teach how to respond to an opioid overdose and how to use a Naloxone kit
- 4. provide a chance for parents to practise using a kit
- 5. respond to questions
- 6. participants will be given their own naloxone kit to take home

Naloxone is a medication that can quickly reverse the effects of an overdose from opioids such as heroin, morphine, fentanyl, carfentanil, and codeine. Opioids are most often prescribed for pain relief. However, in recent years, highly-toxic synthetic opioids are being made in illegal labs and sold on the streets, often mixed with other drugs.
