Learning Updates (Report Cards)

This reporting period, Learning Updates will be available two ways – a hard copy will go home with your child today and report cards will be uploaded into CSL, a digital service developed by the Greater Victoria School District, to facilitate both reporting on the Core Competencies and uploading/storing of report cards.

Accessing Parent Connect:

Parents and guardians can view their child's report card through the Parent Connect. You can find this account sign in here: <u>https://parentconnect.sd61.bc.ca/Identity/Account/Login?ReturnUrl=%2F</u>

Follow the prompts to either log in or create an account. Once you have access, click on the left icon "Assessment History". This will bring you to the assessment page, where you will be able to see at least two or three icons.

One icon is the report on Core Competencies, which will be uploaded in early December. The other icon is your child's report card. There may be a third icon, which is Grad Status.

Another route to access report cards is to have your child log-in to their Student Connect and click on the left icon, "Assessment History". There you will be able to see all three icons, including their report card.

Naloxone training for parents

Please join us on Monday, November 27th for a hands-on Naloxone training session provided by Victoria's Youth Clinic, The Foundry. Nursing staff and a peer support worker will be presenting.

Naloxone is a medication which reverses the effects of opioids, including Fentanyl. It is given in instances of opioid overdose to reverse the negative effects, including the decreased drive to breathe.

The opioid crisis affects many in our school community and this is an opportunity to learn how to administer this life saving medication.
