The Water is Life Exchange program is a partnership exchange between Maurick College in the Netherlands and Oak Bay High. Oak Bay students will visit Maurick College in April 2025 and Maurick students will visit Oak Bay High in May 2025. This exchange is open to grades 10-12, with priority for higher grades up to 8 students.

Students will have the opportunity to:

-Develop practical scientific field skills.

-Engage in a local, relevant, real world research project.

-Earn 4 credits through 'Directed Studies' course.

-Develop friendships and collaborative networks through an exchange with Maurick College.

-Visit and experience the culture of the Netherlands, including a chance to visit Amsterdam.
