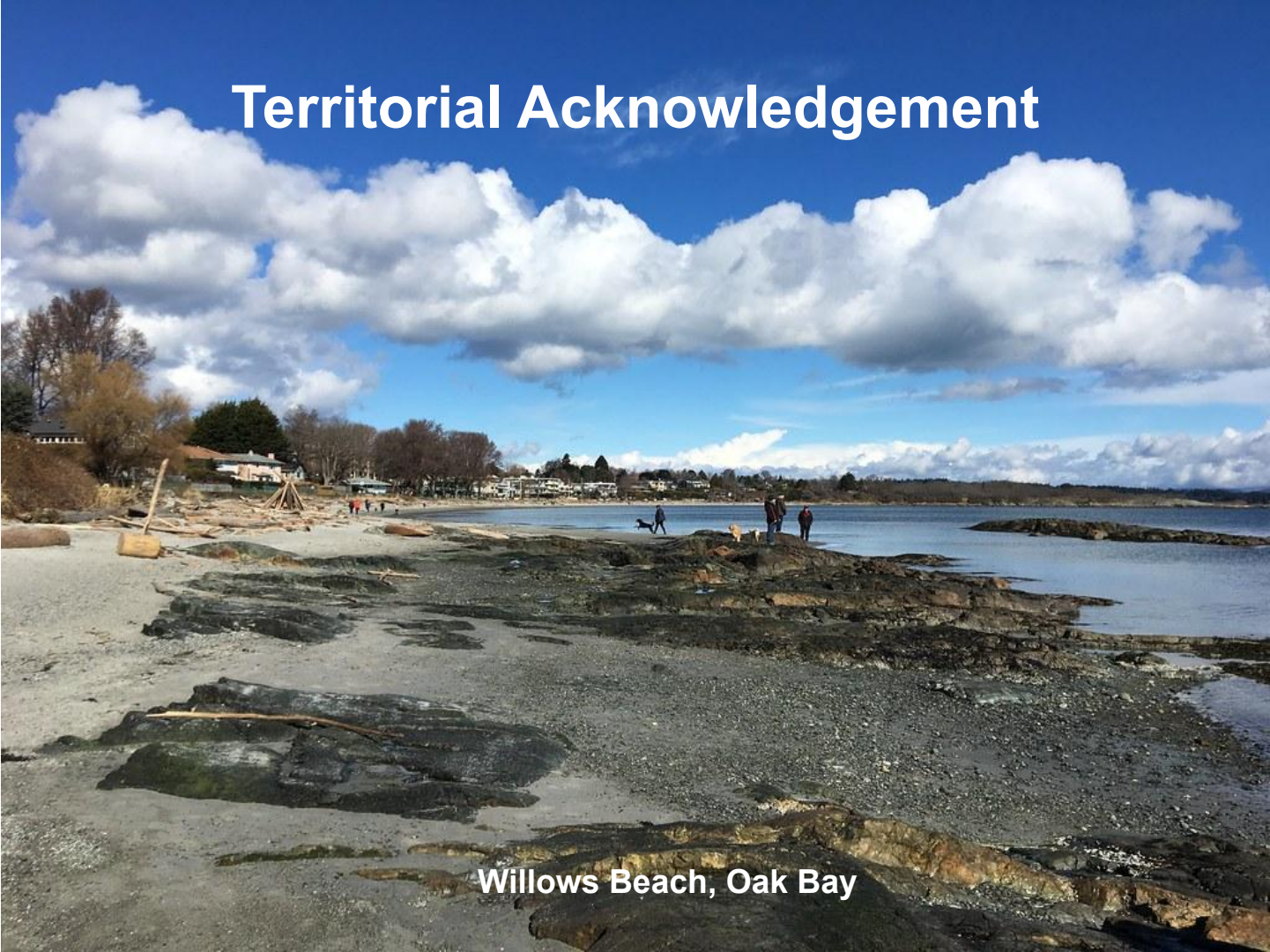

Building Security (Open Campus):

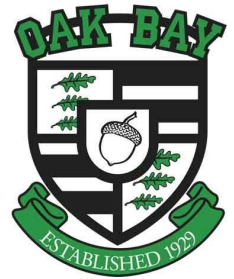
After 9:30, all school doors will be locked, except for the main entrance.

When returning to the school after spares, breaks, or lunch, please use the main doors.



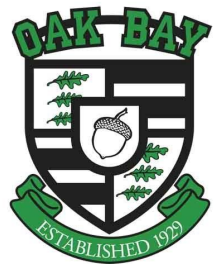
Code of Conduct Highlights:

Safe, Caring, and Orderly Schools



- **Safe** schools are ones in which everyone is free of the fear of harm

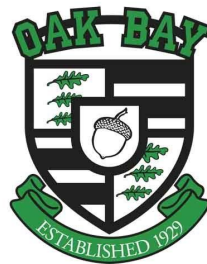


Code of Conduct Highlights:

Expected Conduct

All members of our school community are expected to behave in a responsible and respectful manner while at school and while attending school functions at any location. These expectations include, in part:

- Treating all members of our learning community with dignity, respect, and kindness
- Respecting school property and personal property
- Arriving on time to all classes, using class time effectively, and being prepared to learn
- Voicing opinions respectfully using polite and inclusive language
- Maintaining a food and scent sensitive environment (including being aware and respectful of those with food or scent allergies)
- Driving personal vehicles safely and parking in designated student spaces (Gr11/12)



Code of Conduct Highlights:

Unacceptable Conduct

All members of our school community are expected to behave in ways that do not infringe on the rights and freedoms of others to have a safe, caring, and orderly school environment. **Unacceptable conduct includes**, in part:

- Acts of hate, racism, violence, bullying, etc. (physical, verbal, online or otherwise)
- Visiting other school campuses without permission
- Possession, use, or distribution illegal substances and weapons
- Plagiarism, cheating, or inappropriate use of AI
- Taking, producing, or distributing photos, videos, or audio recordings of students or staff without consent from the individual

ACCEPTABLE USE OF Internet / Technology

- Students are expected to follow restrictions set by their school and/or school staff, such as storing devices out of sight and on silent or airplane mode.
- During instructional hours (this includes FOCUS), usage is at the teacher's discretion and direction for instructional purposes and digital literacy...

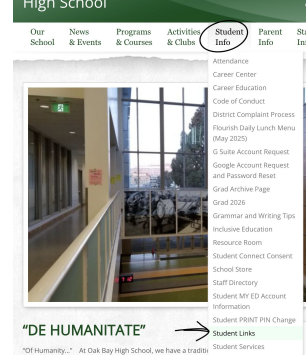

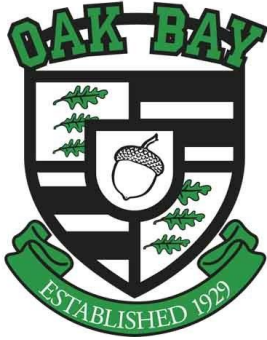

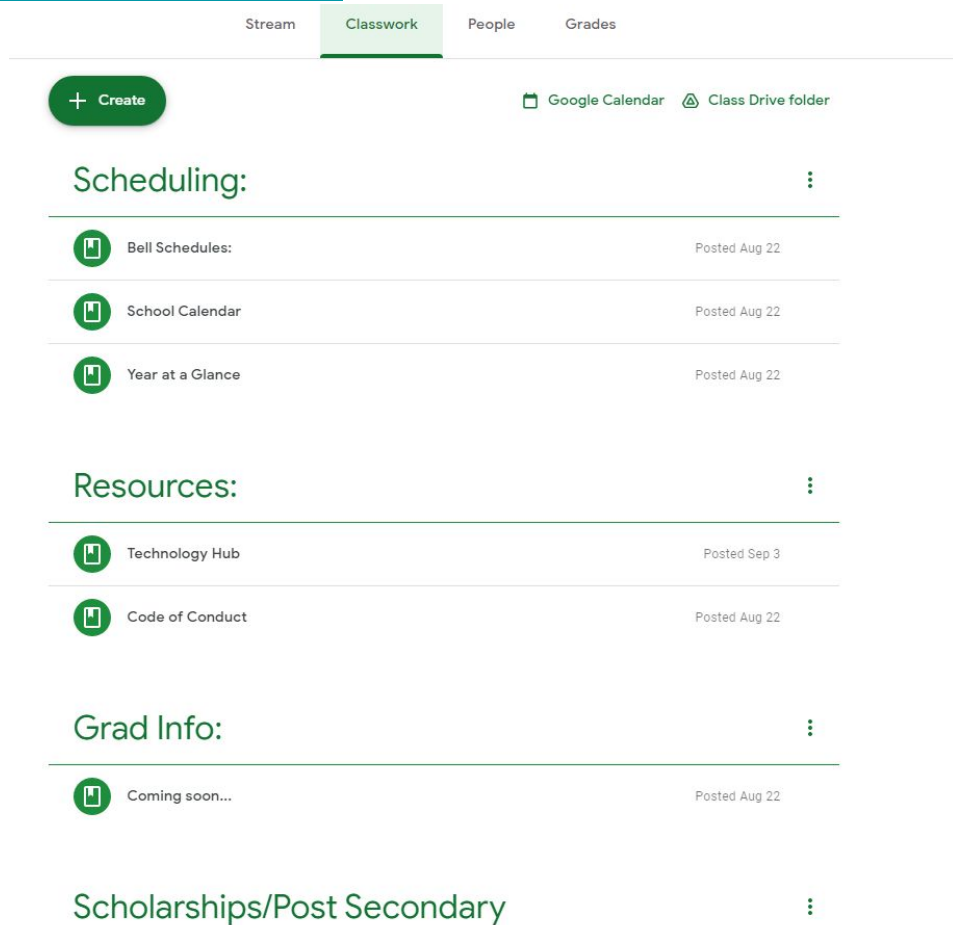

Career Centre

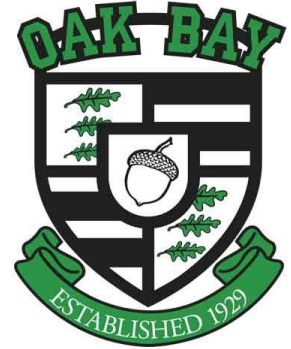
The Career Centre staff coordinate opportunities for students to investigate possible pathways after high school.
